Parents and students, with Christian joy, let us pursue the faith that the Holy Spirit has implanted within us through the gospel in Baptism and God's Word.

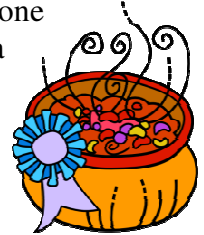
## **Box Tops**

## 4K News

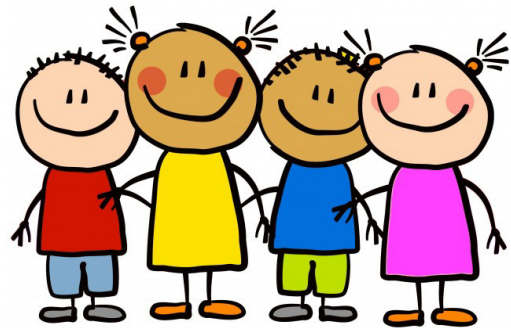
I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas break. Here are just a few reminders for the New Year.
